

# The Wyoming Valley Quilt Block (in 4 different sizes)



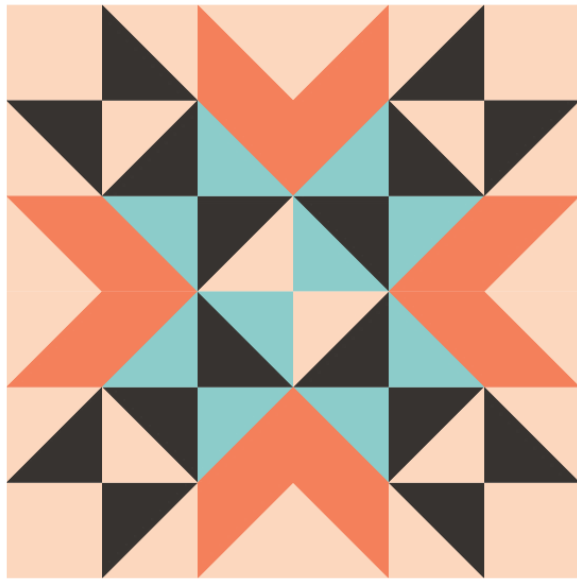

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# Wyoming Valley Quilt Block



You need 4 fabrics ranging from light to dark.



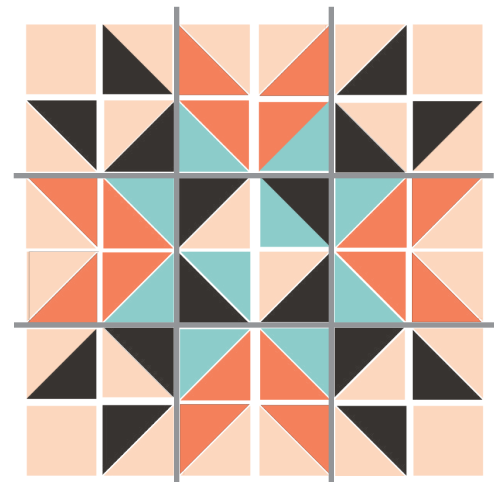
Use the chart below to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. For example, if you want a 6" block, you would use the measurements given in the highlighted column below. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut either once or twice on the diagonal.

## REMEMBER:

Even when you're "finished" making the block, we call it an "unfinished" block until it is sewn into a quilt.

## Cutting Chart:

## Block Assembly:

NOTE: For all seams, use a scant 1/4" seam and a 2.0 mm stitch length.

Arrange your patches as shown in the diagram above. Take note of how the gray lines indicate a 9-patch construction

First sew all HST (Half Square Triangle) units together to make squares. Press each HST to the dark side. Sew the four "square" in each 9-patch unit together, then assemble in typical 9-patch fashion.

Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 6" finished block, your block should measure 6.5")
