## The Barn Quilt Block



## Cutting Chart:

| Piece |  | FINISHED SIZE |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
|  |  | 9" |
| A | Cut 1 square | $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ |
| B | Cut 1 rectangle | $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1$ " |
| C | Cut 1 rectangle | $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ |
| D | Cut 2 rectangles | $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ |
| E | Cut 1 square, then subcut on the diagonal | $27 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ |
| F | Cut 2 squares, then subcut on the diagonal | $27 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ |
| G | Cut 2 rectangles | $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ |
| H | Cut 1 square | $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ |
| 1 | Cut 2 squares, then subcut on the diagonal | $17 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 17 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ |
| J | Cut 2 squares | 21/2" $\times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ |
| K | Cut 1 rectangle | $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ |

Tip: When you attach piece IG to the side of the ABC units, make sure your triangle tips extend above unit $A B C$ just enough to allow for your quarter inch seam.

Please read this document thoroughly before making your block. It is recommended that you make a test block first to insure accuracy before cutting blocks for an entire quilt.

Sew all pieces together using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam and a 2.0 mm stitch.
Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 9" finished block, your block should measure 9.5" before sewing it into a quilt or project.)

## Block Assembly:

After you have cut all your pieces, arrange them as shown in the illustration above.

Sew your pieces together in the following order:

1. Sew rectangle $B$ to the bottom of Square $A$.
2. Sew Rectangle $C$ to the bottom of the piece you made in step 1
3. Sew triangle I to rectangle G. (Make two)
4. Sew an IG unit to each side of your ABC unit.
5. Sew an I triangle to each side of square H .
6. Sew your IHI unit to the top of the unit you completed in step 4. It should now look like a very tall house.
7. Sew an F triangle to each top corner of the "house" unit you made in step 5 so that the entire unit is rectangular.
8. Take triangles E and F and sew to make an EF square. (Make two)
9. Attach a D rectangle to the top of each EF square. (Make two)
10. Sew a J rectangle to the bottom of each DEF unit. (Make two.)
11. Sew the units you made in step 10 to each side of your tall house unit. You're done!
