

## The Bear's Paw Quilt Block Pattern



## You need 3 fabrics ranging from light to dark.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 7" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:



= Subcut once on the diagonal



= Subcut twice on the diagonal

Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 14" finished block, your block should measure 14.5")

## **Block Assembly:**

Arrange your pieces as shown in the exploded diagram. First, make 4 Corner units, To do this, begin by making 8 small HSTs. Sew your HST's together in pairs. Carefully following the diagram, attach a pair of HST's to one side of each of your large squares. Take your remaining pairs of HST's and (again referring to the diagram) attach a light outer square to the end of each pair. Make sure your light and dark trian-

gles are positioned as directed in the diagram. To complete the corner unit, sew a HST pair + small square to an HST pair + large square unit.

Assemble the remaining pieces like a 9-patch.
