

The Dakota Gold Quilt Block Pattern (in 4 different sizes)




Skill level: Intermediate

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Dakota Gold Quilt Block Pattern



You will need 5 fabrics ranging from very light to very dark.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 10" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:



= Subcut once on the diagonal



= Subcut twice on the diagonal

Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 10" finished block, your block should measure 10.5")

Block Construction:

Arrange your patches as shown in the exploded diagram.

First sew all HST (Half Square Triangle) units together to make squares. Then sew together three HST units plus a light square to make a corner unit. (Make 4)

Continue to assemble the remaining pieces as if the block were a 9-patch.
