## The Weathervane Quilt Block Pattern



## You need 3 fabrics ranging from light to dark.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 10" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:

= Subcut once on the diagonal
= Subcut twice on the diagonal
Sew all pieces together using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam and a 2.0 mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a $9^{\prime \prime}$ finished block, your block should measure $9.5^{\prime \prime}$ )

## Block Assembly:

Arrange your patches as shown in the exploded diagram.
First, sew piece $C$ to Piece $E$ to assemble HST units. Make 8 .
Next make house units. To make them, sew two piece G's to the corners of a piece F. You will use the Quick Corner technique, that is used when making flying geese or square-in-a-square units. Make 4

Take a Pieces B, D and two CE HSTs to assemble a corner unit. Make 4
Now that all main units are constructed, assemble the rest of the block as you would assemble a standard 9-patch.
