




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The Weathervane Quilt Block Pattern



You need 3 fabrics ranging from light to dark.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 10" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:




= Subcut once on the diagonal

= Subcut twice on the diagonal

Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 9" finished block, your block should measure 9.5")

Block Assembly:

Arrange your patches as shown in the exploded diagram.

First, sew piece C to Piece E to assemble HST units. Make 8.

Next make house units. To make them, sew two piece G's to the corners of a piece F. You will use the Quick Corner technique, that is used when making flying geese or square-in-a-square units. Make 4

Take a Pieces B, D and two CE HSTs to assemble a corner unit. Make 4

Now that all main units are constructed, assemble the rest of the block as you would assemble a standard 9-patch.

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
