


The Cross and Crown Quilt Block Pattern

(in 4 different sizes)





The Cross and Crown Quilt Block Pattern



You need 2 fabrics ranging from light to dark.





Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 10" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:

= Subcut once on the diagonal



= Subcut twice on the diagonal

Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 10" finished block, your block should measure 10.5")

Block Assembly:

Arrange your patches as shown in the exploded diagram.

First, make 8 DE units, being careful to sew them together along the short side of the triangles.

Then attach two DE units to two adjacent sides of each C square. Make sure you are sewing the long/hypotenuse side of the E patch to the side of the C square. This should create a half triangle.

Next, sew the CDE half triangle units you made to the B pieces to make a corner unit square. (You will make four of these corner units)

Continue to assemble the remaining pieces as if the block were a 9-patch.
