

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## The Tulip Lady Fingers Quilt Block Pattern



## You need 3 fabrics ranging from light to dark.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 10" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:



= Subcut once on the diagonal

=

= Subcut twice on the diagonal

Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 10" finished block, your block should measure 10.5")

## **Block Assembly:**

Arrange your patches as shown in the exploded diagram. The first step is to sew C and D pieces together to make 8 HSTs. Next, sew the HST units to an A and a B square to make 4 corner units.

Assemble the rest of the block pieces together with your corner units as if making a 9-patch.
