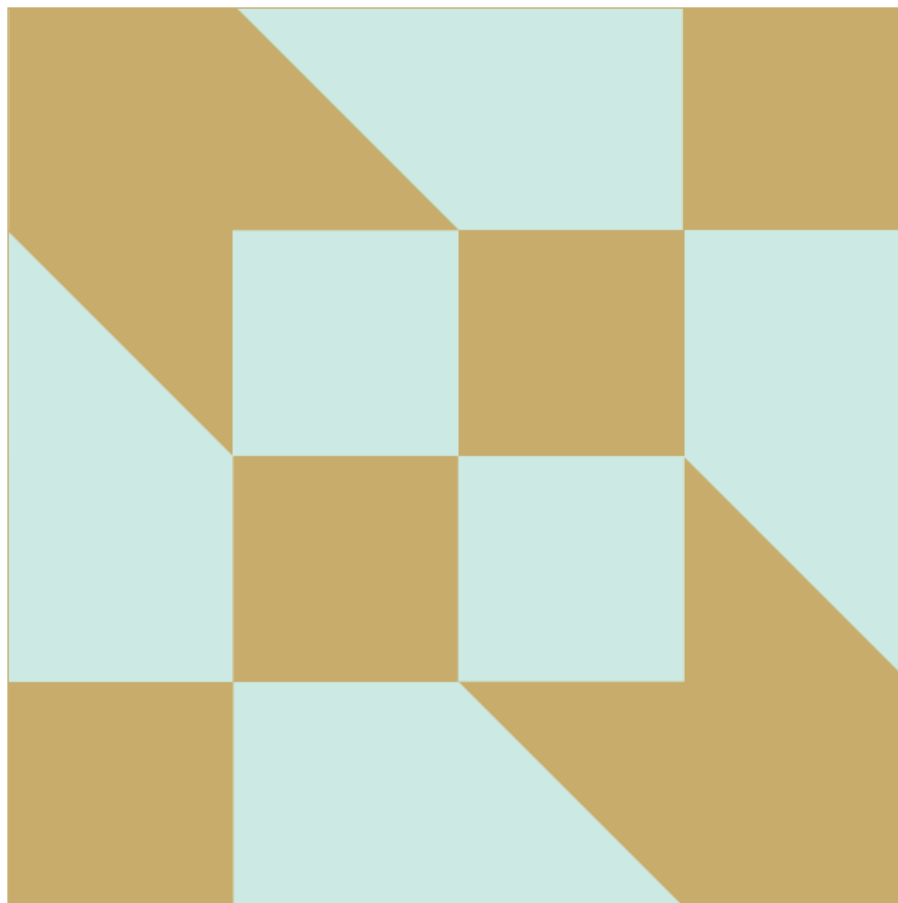


# The Road to Oklahoma Quilt Block Pattern (in 7 different sizes)



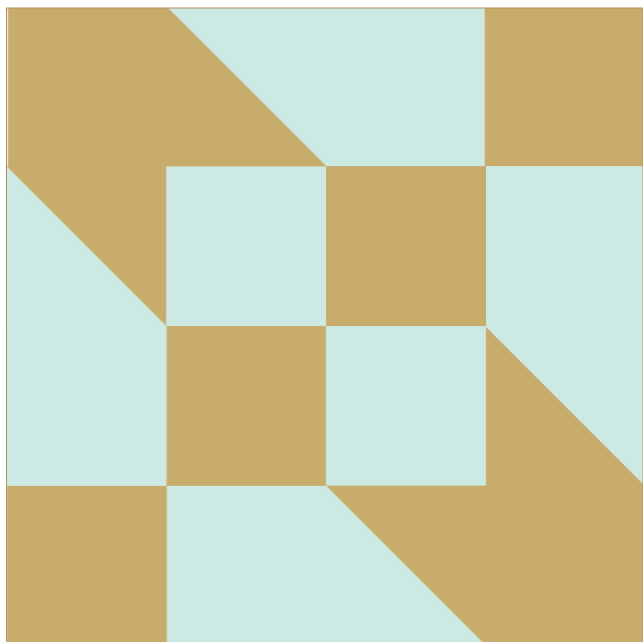

# The Road to Oklahoma Quilt Block Pattern



You need a light and a dark fabric.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 10" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:



= Subcut once on the diagonal



= Subcut twice on the diagonal

Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 10" finished block, your block should measure 10.5")

## Block Assembly:

Arrange your patches as shown in the diagram at right, paying careful attention to how you turn and position your light and dark triangles.

Begin by making your HST units. (Make 4) Press to the dark side. Next, assemble all the units in each row together, again paying careful attention to how the colors are positioned.

Finally, sew all four rows together to complete the block.
