

The Bouquet Quilt Block Pattern (in 7 different sizes)



Skill level: Confident Beginner

A block pattern from



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You will need up to 6 fabrics ranging in value from light to dark.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 6" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:



= Subcut once on the diagonal

= Subcut twice on the diagonal

Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 10" finished block, your block should measure 10.5")

Block Construction:

Arrange your patches as shown in the exploded diagram. You will have three pieces left over that you can save to use in another project. Those pieces are a small white HST, a small dark HST and a large dark HST.

First sew all HST (Half Square Triangle) units together to make squares, pressing to the dark side.

Next, sew the four units in the top left corner, to make a 2x2 square.

Then sew the blue/white HST to the small blue triangle. Likewise, sew the green/white HST to the small green triangle. Attach these units to the sides of your 2x2 square, then attach your large dark triangle to the corner of this unit, to make a square.

Attach one rectangle to the side of your square unit. Sew the remaining rectangle to the your last remaining HST to make your bottom row.

Finally, sew on the bottom row and you are done!
