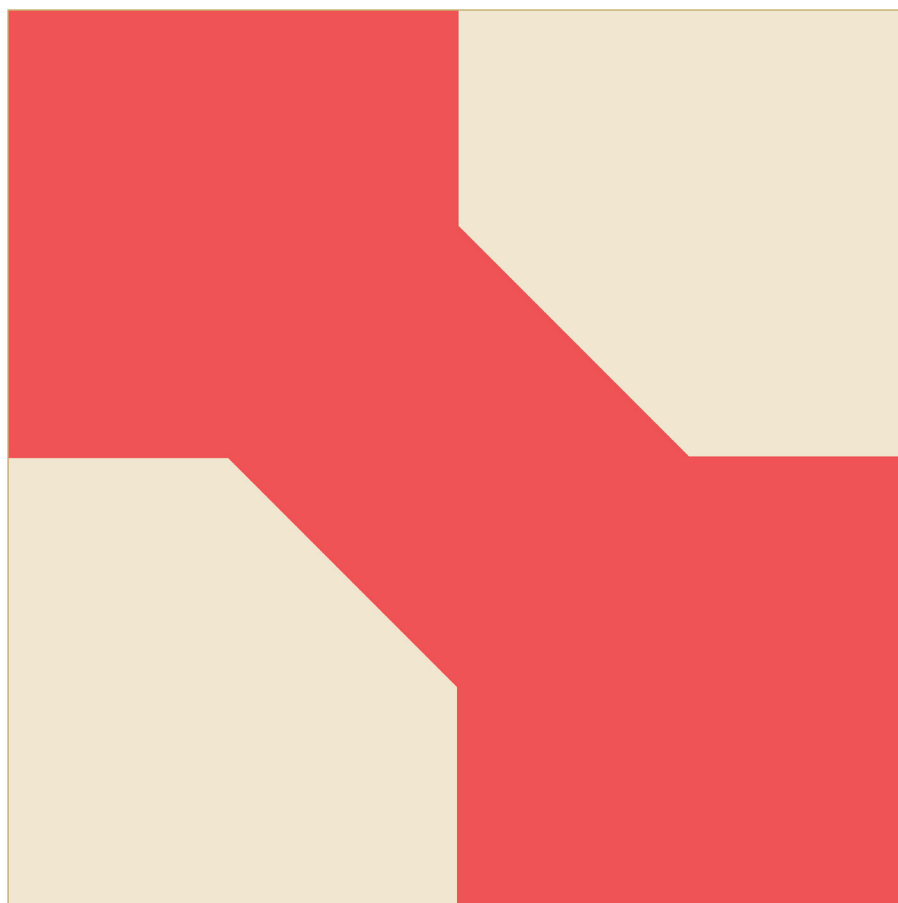

(in 5 different sizes)



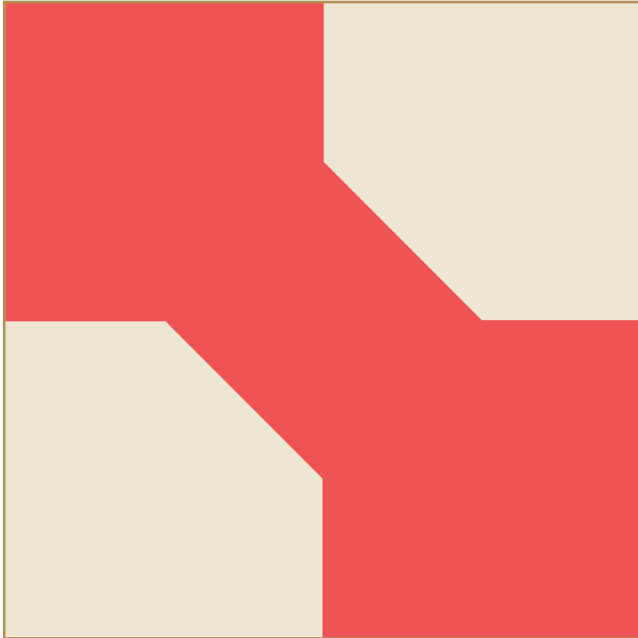

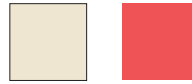

The Bowtie Quilt Block Pattern



You need 2 fabrics — a light and a dark.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 6" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:






= Subcut once on the diagonal



= Subcut twice on the diagonal

Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 10" finished block, your block should measure 10.5")

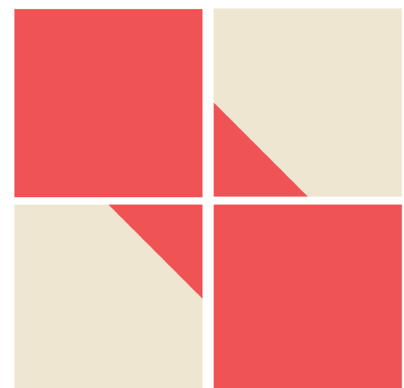
Cutting Chart:

| Patch Shape | | Subcut? | FINISHED SIZE | | | | |
|-------------------------|---|---------|---------------|--------|--------|--------|--------|
| | | | 6" | 9" | 10" | 12" | 15" |
| A (Cut 2) |  | No | 3 1/2" | 5" | 5 1/2" | 6 1/2" | 8" |
| B (Cut 2) |  | No | 3 1/2" | 5" | 5 1/2" | 6 1/2" | 8" |
| C (Cut 2) (for HSTs) |  | No | 2 7/8" | 3 7/8" | 4 1/4" | 4 7/8" | 5 7/8" |

Block Assembly:

Step 1 is to "snowball" one corner of each of the A pieces using a C square. With right sides together and outside edges aligned, sew a Piece C square to a Piece A square using the [Quick Corner/Sew and Flip method](#). Trim excess and press to the dark side,

Arrange your pieces as shown in the exploded diagram at right. Sew each row together, then attach the two rows to make a 4-patch.
