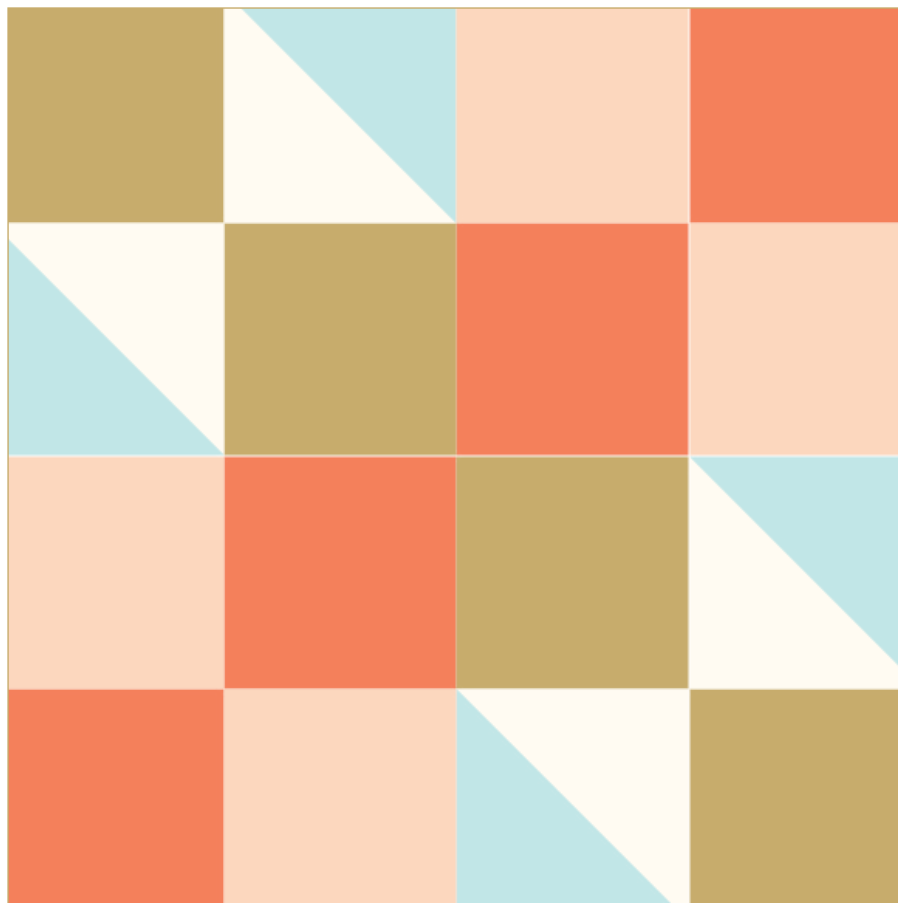


The Arkansas Crossroads Quilt Block Pattern (in 7 different sizes)



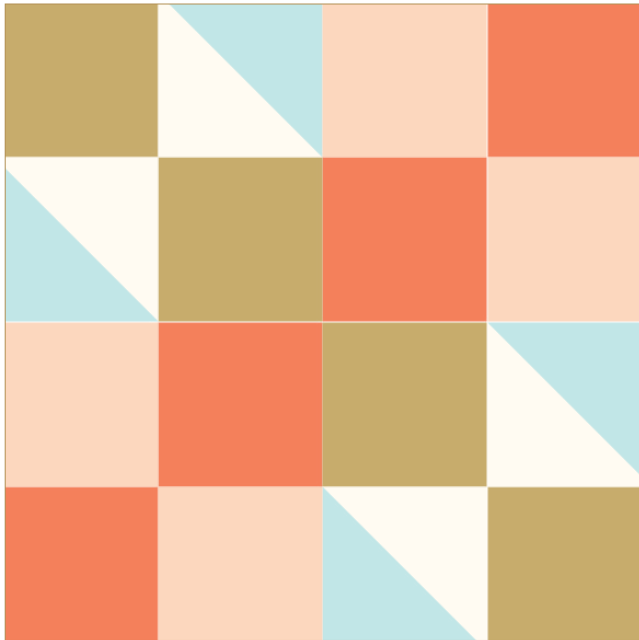

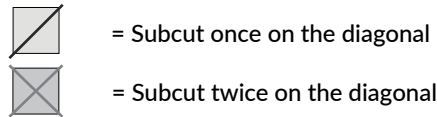
The Arkansas Crossroads Quilt Block Pattern



You need 5 fabrics ranging from light to dark.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 10" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:



Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 10" finished block, your block should measure 10.5")

Block Assembly:

Arrange your patches as shown in the exploded diagram.

First, make 4 HST Unit squares using the HST pieces you cut as directed above. Press seams to the dark side.

Next, sew together all the blocks in each row.
Finally, sew all four rows together as shown to create block.
