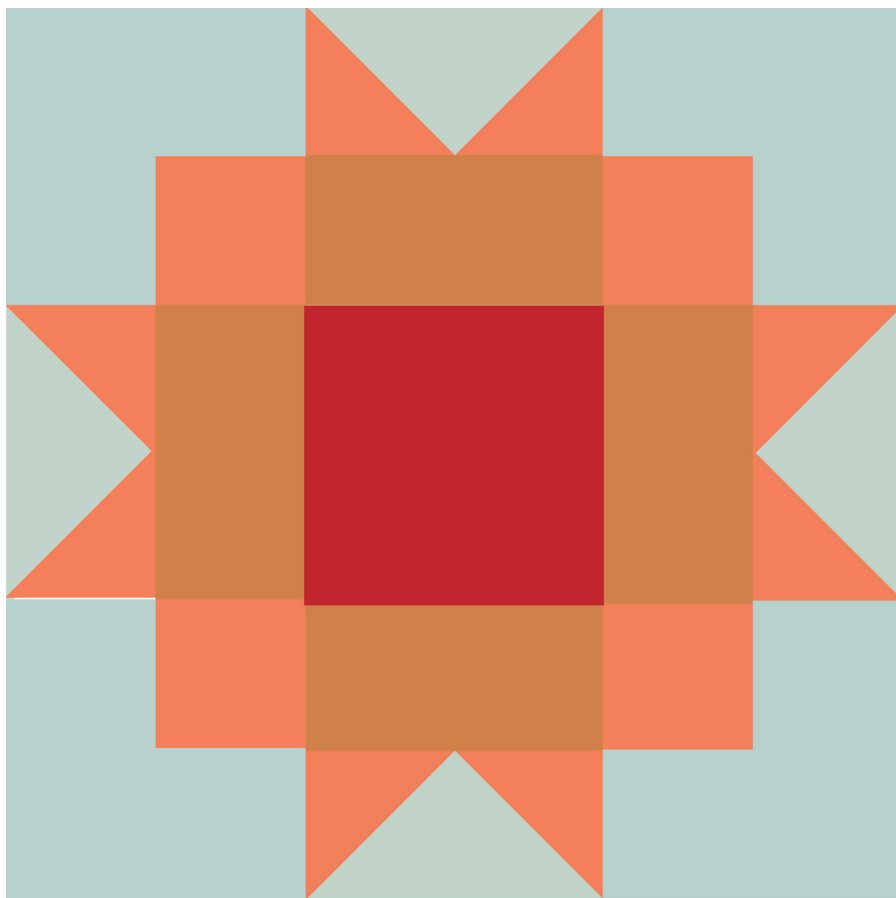


Maple Star Quilt Block Pattern (in 3 different sizes)



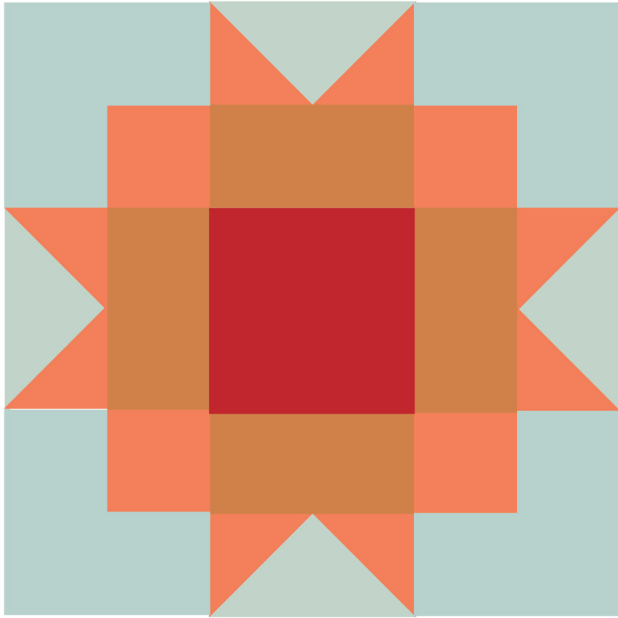

The Attic Window Quilt Block Pattern



You need 4 fabrics ranging from light to dark.



Use the chart to determine what size to cut your patchwork pieces. (For a 6" block, use the measurements in the highlighted column.) When only one measurement is given in the chart, that indicates that the piece is cut as a square of that size. The chart may also indicate that some of your squares may need to be subcut:



= Subcut once on the diagonal



= Subcut twice on the diagonal

Sew all pieces together using a 1/4" seam and a 2.0mm stitch. Your unfinished block should measure 1/2" more than your finished size. (i.e. For a 10" finished block, your block should measure 10.5")

Cut 4		No	1 1/2" x 2 1/2"	2 1/2" x 4 1/2"	3 1/2" x 6 1/2"
Cut 12 (Use 8 for flying geese)		No	1 1/2"	2 1/2"	3 1/2"
Cut 4		No	1 1/2"	2 1/2"	3 1/2"
Cut 8 (use 4 for flying geese)		No	1 1/2" x 2 1/2"	2 1/2" x 4 1/2"	3 1/2" x 6 1/2"

Block Assembly:

Arrange your pieces as shown in the exploded diagram at right. First sew your flying geese units using [the sew 'n flip method](#). Then assemble each row. Once each row is complete, sew the 5 rows together to complete the block.
